On Monday, we were delighted to receive news of excellent VCE results. Despite the many COVID related disruptions during senior schooling, the class of 2022 demonstrated resolve and commitment to their studies that was beyond their years.

The following is a brief summary of results which are an impressive reflection of a fine young group of graduates. They reflect the extraordinary efforts of our students and the work of our teachers, guiding and supporting our students throughout their learning journey at the School to achieve their very best, be that with an impressive ATAR score or through being selected for employment.

We congratulate Jessica Mangan for her perfect score in Further Maths and Riley Inglis for his perfect score in Business Management.

3% of students achieved study scores above 40, placing them in the top percentile bracket for the state.

4 students achieved ATARs in the 90's with Jessica Mangan recognised as Dux with her amazing score of 98.35. Riley Inglis was runner up Dux with a fantastic score of 98.25.


Seasparrow: by Kristen Cashore 2022


No Apologies: Star Netballer Champion Footballer Only Human: by Sharni Layton 2021

Before Sharni Layton became an All-Australian AFLW star, she was a gun netballer. By 2017, she had been named ANZ Championship Player of the Year, was captain of the Diamonds and had won Commonwealth Games Gold along with two World Cups for Australia. On the outside it looked as if she was living the dream. On the inside, it was different. Her confidence was shot and a career's worth of suppressed anxiety finally boiled over, leading to full-blown burnout.



The Price Paid: by Tim Paine 2022

Tim Paine was the golden child of Australian cricket. Paine was the youngest-ever contracted player in Australia at 16 years old. Paine's three-year turn at Test captaincy was turbulent on the pitch, with a slew of narrow wins and close, tough results. Then, in November 2021, a sexting scandal saw him step down as Australia's Test captain, taking an indefinite break from the game. As the scandal has played out in the public spotlight, Paine has had to grapple with the effect of the aftermath on his marriage, his career and his reputation. He made a mistake and paid the price. In a frank, heartfelt autobiography, Tim Paine reflects on the highs and lows of his prestigious career, his time as a captain, what the baggy green means to him and the impact one choice can have on a life.

In January 2023, your SIMON Everywhere /PAM account will be undergoing a major upgrade to provide greater security and other improved functionality.

During the week of the 16th of January 2023, your current SIMON Everywhere/PAM account will cease to function.

New PAM accounts will then be created by your school, and you will receive an email asking you to create new credentials for a new PAM account.

This will be as simple as:

- clicking on the link provided in the email
- following the prompts to create a new password for your new account.
- opening the SIMON Everywhere app and log out of your old account
- navigating to the "Tools" menu in SIMON Everywhere and then "Add School"
- finding your school on the list and clicking on the "Login" button for Parent Access
- using your new credentials to log into your new PAM account via SIMON Everywhere

Your username will be your email address.

Your SIMON Everywhere/PAM interface will not look any different, but you may receive an account per parent if you were previously sharing an account with your spouse.

Please refer to the below FAQs for further information:

- 1. We have a single, family email address that is used by both parents. Is that still ok?
 - a. If the parents both use the same email address, you will only receive a PAM account for one parent. i. Example single email:
- Parent 1 Mother Mrs Joanne Smith jandcsmith@myemail.com
- Parent 2 Father Mr Chris Smith jandcsmith@myemail.com

A PAM ACCOUNT CAN ONLY BE ASSIGNED TO ONE PARENT, who can then share their login credentials with their spouse.

- 1.I do not have an email address OR have not provided my email address to the school.
 - a. Parents with no email address provided cannot have a PAM account
- 2. Will any historic data be lost in this process?
 - a. While no data will be lost in this process, it is possible that some information may become disconnected from the new account, such as historic letters, historic excursion permission and historic parent notified absences.
 - b. You may have to review your personal details (Medicare number etc) if you previously had split access with another parent to your child's medical information.
 - c. You will definitely still be able to access historic student assessment reports and learning area assessment tasks. However, access to historical parent reflections may be lost if the school has chosen to not allow parents to see reflections by other parent accounts attached to that student.
- 3. What do I need to do now?
 - a. This letter is to simply let you know about the changes that are coming. Right now, the best thing you can do is make sure that the school has your preferred email address on file.
- 4. What do I need to do in January?
 - a. Be aware that your current SIMON Everywhere/PAM account will stop working as of the 16th of January.
 - b. Look out for the email later in that week asking you to set up credentials for your new account (this may go to your junk/spam folder).
