Flooding Techniques

Cake decorating "flooded techniques" typically involve using a thin, pourable icing, such as Royal icing or a runny consistency of buttercream, to create a smooth and even surface on a cake. This technique is commonly used in biscuit decorating as well.

Outline: Use a thicker icing to outline the design you want to flood on the biscuit. This will act as a barrier to contain the thinner icing.

Flood: Pour or pipe the thin, coloured icing into the outlined area. Try to distribute it as evenly as possible, so it covers the entire area. You can use a small paintbrush or the back of a spoon to help spread the icing to the edges.

European Holiday



Cyndi Gleeson recently returned from her Long Service Leave in Europe. On her travels, she dropped into the Mercy Convent in Wexford Ireland to catch up with the Mercy Sisters who she had met on her first visit to Wexford in 2011. Cyndi and Sr Mary at the Mercy Convent spent the day together going through the archives and discussing the history and founding of the Mercy education in Yarrawonga. Sr Mary was thrilled to learn that the Witt St Campus was named after the town of Wexford.

In 1888 Father Kennedy of Yarrawonga suggested to the Bishop of Sandhurst that they establish a convent at Yarrawonga. The Convent would cost 6000 pounds with 3000 pounds to be financed by the parishioners of Yarrawonga. The remainder of the building work was to be carried out when the money was available. The contract was put in hand and a foundation stone was laid by Dr Crane, who was the Bishop of Sandhurst in 1889. At this time there were very few teaching orders of nuns in Australia. Bishop Reville of Sandhurst was given the task of recruiting nuns while on a visit to Ireland. Reveille prevailed upon the Sisters of Mercy at Wexford in Ireland to send a community of nuns to Yarrawonga on the Murray River in North East Victoria. The four sisters chosen were mother Mary Ignatius Walsh, Sister Mary Patrick Fahy, Sister Peter Furlong and Sister Mary of the Sacred Heart Kelly. Mother Walshe was to stay in Yarrawonga for two years and firmly established her charges at the Yarrawonga Convent.

Leaving Wexford on the 7th of February 1890 the small group of missionaries arrived in Yarrawonga on April 20th 1890 by train from Benalla after a 73 day voyage, mostly by ship to Yarrawonga. On Monday, April 28th 1890, the Primary School opened with 74 pupils.

17 year-old Quell has lived her entire life on the run. She and her mother


have fled from city to city, in order to hide the deadly magic that flows through Quell's veins.




